

L&I offers claim-free discounts for businesses

The Washington State Department of Labor & Samp; Industries L&I offers discounts on workers & #39; compensation insurance premiums for small businesses that keep a safe workplace and avoid injuries. Businesses may qualify for discounts if they did not have claims resulting in payments to injured workers in the last 3 years. Employers who actively work to maintain a safe workplace tend to have cheaper premiums. L&I offers many resources to help manage claims and expenses even if your business has had claims previously. Your business may be eligible for a claim-free discount if, in the last 3 years, your business had no:

Claims that result in time-loss payments to the injured worker.

Claims that result in loss of earning power. Claims that result in either partial or total permanent disability.

Claims for death benefits.

Your business may qualify for **10-40% off** the base rates for your industry!
